

Mobile telephones (GSM) and cameras are not allowed in the plant. You can carry a GSM without a camera only as far as the Control Room.

GSM with camera is only permitted in the administration area. If you have a camera best leave it in your car. You will not be allowed to use it without a permit and, security may confiscate it at the gate pending your departure. If your visit requires plant photography, please get this agreed in advance with your host so that the necessary formalities can be completed.

Your computer (laptop) must be registered with security so expect to be searched at the gate if you are carrying a bag.

In case of illness

Oman LNG has a clinic at site and at the residential complex. In each case there is a medical doctor and a nurse. The clinics are open only during normal working hours i.e. 0730 till 16:15. In case of illness outside of normal working hours you can also go directly to the new Sur hospital accident and emergency wing. OLNG visitors should ring the Company Doctor and he will ease the formalities in case of hospital visit.

Important Information for Visitors to Oman LNG Manufacturing Complex at Sur

Arrival at Seeb International Airport

Immigration

This is very straightforward. If you already have a visa just join the line in the immigration hall and within a short time you will be processed and can then enter the luggage collection area. NB Business visas need to be arranged in advance.

The No Objection Certificate can be picked up in the immigration hall and then join the queue for processing the entry formalities. Tourist visas may be purchased in the immigration hall. These visas have a maximum validity of one month.

Luggage is further screened by airport security before you are allowed out of the restricted area and into the arrivals hall.

If transport has been arranged for you, usually the driver will be there with a placard bearing your name.

Vehicle hire

If you are arranging your own transport, there are a number of reputable car hire firms in the arrivals hall e.g. Hertz.

Note that visitors to O LNG arriving on an international flight are not permitted to drive themselves to the site following a night flight. This is for reasons of personal safety.

There is always a line of taxis immediately outside the arrivals hall. Taxi fare to the hotels varies from 6 to 8 Omani Riyal.

Driving to Sur

Driving in Oman is probably the biggest hazard you will face. The number of road traffic accidents is very high. You need to be alert at all times and drive in a very defensive manner. When you see a traffic queue approaching always be prepared for oncoming vehicles to suddenly pull out onto your side of the road, and if you are in a queue of cars, watch out for the mad over-taker from behind.

It is mandatory to call the police for any accident – do not move the car even if it is blocking the road. It is essential to carry vehicle documentation and your driving license.

Oman LNG does not permit driving to/from Sur/Muscat in the dark. The presence of many roadside animals makes this an unacceptable risk.

Coastal road

The use of the coastal road is not advised. During the winter months the wadis may be subject to flash floods and the roads can quite dangerous. A

four wheel drive is essential and even then there have been instances of vehicles being swept away by the fast running water.

O LNG employees are not permitted to use this route when on business travel, and if O LNG is arranging transport, this route is also forbidden for visitors.

Although the distance is about 180 km, the journey time is usually around 3 hours.

Inland road

This is the recommended route. The distance is 340 km and journey time around 3.5 hours with a rest break midway in the town of Ibra. The journey is full of contrasts with the mountain pass and then the desert and the famous Wahiba sands.

Speed limit is 120kph on the dual carriageway and 100kph on the single carriageway unless otherwise stated. In both cases there are exceptions so watch out for the road signs.

Speed limits in towns vary between 30 and 70kph. Again watch out for the signs. Oman police use radar especially on the main highways.

There are many instances of animals by the roadside and some are quite unpredictable, especially camels. Keep a very careful look out for them; they can be quite difficult to see. If you see cars coming towards you with their headlights flashing and hazard indicators on, take extra care. There is most likely an animal just ahead. There are also donkeys, goats and sheep, and all love to graze at the roadside.

Security and site access

Before coming to Oman, it is essential for you to supply your host with a copy of your passport main pages. This is for security and site access reasons. Applications for gate passes have to be made at least 24 hour in advance otherwise there may be considerable delay in gaining access. Your host will normally deal with this.

Depending where you need to go, your gate pass will be configured for various entry points e.g. Administration, Operations, Marine gate, LNG jetty. It is essential to get this right first time otherwise further delays will occur.
